Lorries

We have agreed to be part of a project to tackle commercial vehicle issues on Gloucestershire roads. The Gloucestershire Commercial Vehicle Watch Pilot Project is run by TJA Associates on behalf of the Director of Specialist Operations Gloucestershire Constabulary.

The HGV violation issue appears to arise from HGVs loading up with aggregates at Shorncote Quarry (GL7 6DA) and then turning left at the Spratsgate Lane / Ewen Lane junction in order to 'rat run' through the villages of Ewen and Kemble before joining the A429. The junction itself has clear HGV 17t 'Weight limit at Ewen' signs either side of the road. Similarly, the slip road and main junction off the A429 into Kemble village also have clear HGV 17t 'Except for Access' signs.

Anyone for Cricket?

The Parish does not currently have a cricket team. However, Oaksey Cricket Club will soon be taking to the field and after a successful 2022 season which saw the club promoted to Division Six of the Gloucestershire County Cricket League, they are on the lookout for new players.
